"Tribes" has been sweeping the nation after making its debut at London's Royal Court Theatre in 2010.

The story explores many universally valid, important and opposing viewpoints on family, belonging, otherness, language, communication, connection, culture, parenting, identity and re-

sponsibility, said Dámaso Rodriguez, Artists Rep's artistic director who is directing Tribes. "Ultimately, Tribes is not about a particular group, but rather how we all seek to belong to a community we can call our own, and in doing so, how we too often fail to listen," Rodriguez said.
