## Running for President

Former Secretary of State and First Lady Hillary Clinton announced Sunday she will be running for president again in 2016.

## U.S.-Cuban Relations

For the first time in over 20 years, the United States and Cuba sat down for open discussion. President Obama and President Raúl Castro of Cuba sat down together for their first summit since the meetings began in 1994. Obama announced Tuesday that he will remove Cuba from the list of state sponsors of terrorism.

## Double Homicide

On Sunday the Oregon State Medical Examiner identified

the victims of a double homicide that occurred in Southeast Portland on Friday night. Dat Pham, 33, and Sut-Leng Chang, 41, were both fatally shot at the scene.

## Record-breaking Mother

A 65-year-old German woman is making history as one of the oldest women to ever carry quadruplets to term. The woman, who lives in Berlin, is due this summer.

## Man Found Dead

Reports of gunshots drew Portland police to a Northeast Portland park early Tuesday morning. While police searched the neighborhood, a report of a man's body lying in a nearby parking lot came in. It is unclear if the shooting involved the man and a medical examiner will determine the cause of death.



# A Message of Peace

Sybrina Fulton, mother of the now famously slain Florida teen, Trayvon Martin, spoke to a full house Monday night about her life after her son's death. The event, sponsored by the YWCA at the Maranatha Church in Northeast Portland. The crowd was standing-room-only and Fulton delivered and Fulton shared her thoughts on racial profiling and the lives of young black people growing up in the United States under the current political climate. Trayvon Martin, an unarmed black teenager, was killed in Florida in February 2012. His death ignited public debate about the state of race in America.

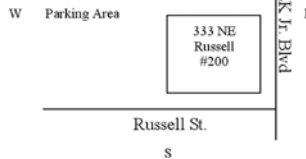
