Sealed bids will be received by the City of Camas, Office of the Finance Department, 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607 until **10:00 A.M., on Tuesday, May 12, 2015**, and will then and there be publicly read for the construction of the improvement.

All bid proposals shall be accompanied by a bid proposal deposit in cash, certified check, cashier's check, or surety bond in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of such bid proposal. Should the successful bidder fail to enter into such contract and furnish satisfactory performance bond within the time stated in the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) 2014 Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge, and Municipal Construction (standard specifications), the bid proposal deposit shall be forfeited to the City of Camas.

Plans and specifications may be picked up at the Camas Municipal Center, Public Works Department, located at 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607. **Plans and Specifications will be available for pickup after 9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, April 28, 2015.** The cost for Plans and specifications is \$75.00 plus 8.4% Sales Tax. The improvement for which bids will be received follows:

Bid opening on Tuesday, May 12, 2015, at 10:00 A.M. at the Camas Municipal Building located at 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607. Sealed bids will be received by the City of Camas Office of the Finance Department, 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607 until 10:00 A.M. Registration as a planholder with the City of Camas is required to obtain Contract Addenda.

Statement of Work:

This Contract provides for the improvement of, The City's sewer system through installation of a new 24-inch PVC and HDPE low-pressure force main that will convey wastewater from the intersection of Joy Street and 6th Avenue to the City's wastewater treatment plant. The proposed force main will be installed in two segments:

1. Segment 1 is 3,100 feet long and runs from the treatment plant to the existing utility bridge over the Washougal River.
2. Segment 2 is 3,920 feet long and runs from Joy Street and 6th Avenue to the existing utility bridge over the Washougal River

Installation of this force main will include construction of the pipeline, air release vaults, road restoration, wetland restoration, and other related items in accordance with the attached Contract Plans and Contract Provisions, and the Standard Specifications.

State Funding:

The Contract is subject to all applicable Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, codes, orders, regulations, policies, and permits of the State of Washington, to include the Departments of

Commerce and Labor and Industries, and the Washington State Public Works Board. All work performed on the project will be subject to the State of Washington Minimum Hourly Prevailing Wage Rates.

Disadvantaged Business Participation: The City of Camas encourages the solicitation and recruitment, to the extent possible, of certified minority-owned (MBE), women-owned (WBE), and emerging small (ESB) businesses, in the construction of this project.

Civil Rights Act:

The City of Camas is an Equal Employment Opportunity employer.
