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for example, that works on issues that affect LGBTQ Portlanders of all backgrounds.

"Some of that really started with the (Urban League's) State of Black Oregon, Lift Every Voice Report from 2012," explained Edwards. Until then, the Urban League did not include statistics that specifically separated out LGBTQ community members. It was a groundbreaking report surrounding key issues, including housing, employment, faith, community acceptance, health, and life expectancy.

"We reached out to the Urban League and our partnership has grown ever since," Edwards said. "Our policy and advocacy work stemmed from

that."

The chapter has pushed for gay marriage rights in Oregon and helped pass the Youth Mental Health Protection Act, a law that bans, for youth under 18, the discredited practice of trying to change a person's sexual orientation, commonly known as conversion therapy.

Other accomplishments include the group's work on the Ban the Box campaign, a movement to help ex felons appropriately re-enter the job market, and adding all protected classes of people, including gay people, to bans against police profiling.

"There is a bill moving forward that will improve data equity to include sexual orientation and gender identity at public colleges and universities," said Edwards. "This is

an effort to improve campus climates and outcomes for students across the state."

PFLAG pushed Multnomah County to improve the data it collects on the people and employees it serves to insure equitable outcomes for race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, and gender identity. County employees can now self-identify by gender, sexuality, and their race or ethnicity. One can choose all that apply, and offer a fuller picture of who is being employed by the county and what their experiences are.

Last week, the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners declared June as official Pride Month, affirming its commitment to supporting LGBTQ issues. Victory was celebrated at the commissioners' office by various city officials and community activists.
