Representatives from across the country will be in Portland this week to focus on the Black Male Achievement initiative.

Portland was selected as one of 11 cities to participate in the national program to improve outcomes for black men and boys. The program is designed to work across public and private sectors and among jurisdictions to help support youth in for key areas – education, employment, family stability, and criminal justice.

At the moment, Portland's chapter is housed in the Office of Equity and Human Rights within Mayor Charle Hales' portfolio, and the organization works with officials in the Multnomah County government, as well as with for-profit and non-profit groups to create access to jobs and mentoring.
