"It's a big case for this family and for Portland, and we need people to know and pay attention if we want to change these laws." Brown said.

An earlier plea for a governor's pardon for Amanuel's relatively minor offenses never got filed, despite paying an attorney to file the paperwork.

"They feel cheated," said Brown. "They paid and there's no evidence he filed it."

If Amanuel can get a governor's pardon, he may be able to move forward in getting a stay and even naturalizing in the future.
