Ophelia in Oblivion

Poet writes play on family trauma, secrets and regrets

One of Portland's celebrated black writers and artists is getting ready to debut a dramatic new full-length play as a staged reading that explores death, karma, guilt and family dysfunction.

S. Renee Mitchell's "Ophelia in Oblivion" will be presented this month as part of the annual Fertile Ground Festival of New Works, an 11-day celebration of new artist works featured at various venues across the city.

Mitchell's production, dealing with a family's trauma, secrets and regrets, began as a dare to write a 10 minute play during a Portland a two-month span, the playwright and poet, a former award-winning columnist for The Oregonian, revised her class homework under the mentorship of celebrated playwright Rich Rubin.
