From Hunger Strikes to Board Rooms

Young activist finds purpose in path for social justice

Activist Cameron Whitten wipes his bike down from the rain as he sits down in his small Union Station office stacked doo-to-door with dozens of other work spaces overlooking Old Town and the Pearl. Whitten is the new leader for the community service organization, Know Your City, and a young African-American male who not so long ago was one of the countless homeless youth passing through the Pacific Northwest, many of whom might be getting off a train or a Greyhound bus right downstairs from where is now employed.

"I will never forget how lucky I was as an 18-year-old homeless youth during one of the worst recessions in American history," he says of his start in Portland six years ago.


