

Until Congress restores the preclearance provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, the Civil Rights Division's litigation efforts will remain crucial to ensuring protection of the voting rights of our citizens.

Call upon President Trump to disband his task force on so-called "voter fraud" and to replace it with a task force on reducing votfraud is a problem warranting the expenditure of public resources on a White House task force. On the other hand, voter suppression is a very real problem, as many recent court decisions have shown. President Trump simply must "get over" the fact that he lost the popular vote and focus on the real problems in our electoral system – low participation and voter suppression.

Absent a preclearance regime, organizations resisting voter suppression efforts must have as much notice as possible in order to challenge such measures before they go into effect.
