## Smith Investigation Followed Process

"Beginning in January, two current and former staff members made serious allegations that Commissioner Loretta Smith had misused county resources and bullied her staff.

Under our rules, the county has a process to thoroughly investigate personnel complaints. We followed that process. As the

Chief Executive Officer, I have an obligation to all employees to maintain a respectful, professional and harassment-free workplace.

Commissioner Smith herself publically asked that the county investigate these allegations.

We were extremely careful with how we proceeded. The county contracted with an inde-

Multnomah County Chair and pendent third-party investigator specializing in employment law. The county also hired an attorney to represent Commissioner Smith in these matters. Finally, Commissioner Smith received an advance copy of the investigator's final report and she had the opportunity to respond.

In light of what is happening in our country right now, we at

Multnomah County take issues of race, gender and religion extremely seriously and strive to ensure that our workplace is free of discrimination. My duty is to ensure that process is followed, regardless of whether those involved are an elected official or line staff.

This isn't about the Commissioner's race, it's about ensuring Multnomah County has a professional and respectful workplace for everyone."
