## Four Shot after Funeral for Shooting Victim

Four people were shot Monday night after a group of people who had gone to a funeral for a recent shooting victim met at the McDonald's restaurant on Swan Island in north Portland, police said. The injured arrived at Legacy Emanuel Medical Center around 10 p.m. and were expected to survive. Dozens of police were on hand to keep the peace.



## Fully Reopening Portland Schools

Superintendent of Portland Public Schools Guadalupe Guerrero announced last week that he expects schools to fully reopen for in-person instruction in the fall. The good news comes as COVID vaccinations continue to grow and dramatically reduce the impact of the disease.

## Demand to Vaccinate Kids Fills Convention Center

Demand for COVID-19 vaccine rebounded in a big way Sunday at the Oregon Convention Center, leaving clinic staff shorthanded and metro-area residents with long waits. It marked the first weekend day of operations at the site since federal and state health officials approved COVID vaccinations for kids age 12 to 15.



## Police Crisis Team Helps Bring Person to Safety

On Sunday morning, authorities said officers from the North Precinct, the Enhanced Crisis Intervention Team and a Crisis Negotiation Team, were able to assist a person on the St. Johns Bridge in a moment of crisis. When the person was brought to safety, the bridge was reopened to traffic.

## New Foreclosure Moratorium Passes Oregon Senate

A bill that would reinstate Oregon's moratorium on foreclosures for those experiencing financial hardship during the coronavirus pandemic passed the state Senate on Monday. The previous state moratorium expired at the end of 2020, but many homeowners continued to struggle to catch up on mortgage payments.

## Supreme Court to Consider Abortion Case

The Supreme Court agreed on Monday to decide a major abortion case from Mississippi that could dramatically alter decades of rulings on abortion rights and eventually lead to dramatic restrictions on abortion access.
