DANISH CABINET RESIGNS. May Prevent the Sale of West Indian Islands.

NEW YORK, March 24.—A special to the World from Washington says: The resignation of the Danish Cabinet means two things of importance to the United States.

First—It is improbable that this country will be able to buy the Danish West Indies for \$4,000,000, as provided for in the Gardner bill, now before the foreign relations committee of the House, or for any other sum.

Second—By the time this Congress adjourns the German flag will be flying over the islands of St. John and St. Thomas of the Danish West Indies group, by right of lease from the Danish government to the Emperor of Germany.

Negotiations between this government and Denmark for the purchase of the islands were practically terminated by the resignation of the Danish Ministry, headed by Prime Minister Heorring.

Germany has been trying to secure the islands; and while it is the determination of Denmark not to sell them to any other country and not to sell them to the United States if it can be avoided, an option for a lease for a long term of years has been given to Germany for the islands of St. Thomas and St. John.
