Condition of the Money Market Is Satisfactory.

INTERIOR BANKS' LARGE RESERVE

New York Stock Market—Weekly Bank Statement—Imports and Exports—Financial News.

The condition of the money market continues to be satisfactory. Merchants and manufacturers are willing to borrow money on the terms that are now offered, feeling certain that they can use it with profit to themselves, and that they will know where to get it out of their hands when the time comes to repay the loans.

The business outlook during the past week was better than it has been for a number of years, and if May opens as April is closing, the prospects for a lively year in nearly all lines of trade will be exceedingly bright. January and February were dull months with the banks, but in March business picked up, and has been increasing steadily since.

Wool has begun to move a little, as is shown by the checks that come in from the buyers of Oregon and elsewhere, and its movement will stimulate business in Eastern Oregon to a great extent.

The sale of timber lands in Oregon, as a result of the thinning of the forest of the Middle West, will be another means of bringing large sums of money into the state.

Trade in all lines is reported good. Wholesale and jobbers find collections better than they have been for a number of months, and find merchants throughout the state not only willing, but eager to make larger purchases.
