The steamship Lennox, fitted out as a Government animal transport by Wolff & Zwicker, of this city, has established a record in carrying animals on long ocean voyages that has not been approached by any transport in the Government service.

Every animal that was taken aboard at Portland was landed at Manila in perfect health, and each weighed from 150 to 200 pounds when they were put aboard at Portland.

Dr. Owens, who has had wide experience in handling horses, states that the Lennox animals not only arrived in the best condition of any horses that have left the coast, but they were also the finest lot that has yet been sent to the Philippines, and are admirably adapted for the service.

THE FREIGHT MARKET.
