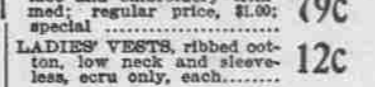

FEARS EXTINCTION OF SALMON

A. Scherneckau Says Fish Are Being Slaughtered.

A. Scherneckau, after whom the new town of Shaniko, in Wasco County, is called, is registered at the Imperial, from Astoria. He kept a trading post in Cross Hollows, on the site of the present terminus of the Columbia Southern Railroad, for several years, and finally sold out the tract to the Lowndes projectors. Mr. Scherneckau is now a retired capitalist, with headquarters at Astoria, and has leisure to observe the fishing industry on the Lower Columbia. He fears the ultimate extinction of the Columbia River chinook, he says, as the American people usually neglect to protect the natural resources of the country until after it is too late; and there is also too much vandalism.

It was the same way with the buffalo on the great plains of the Missouri Valley," he said yesterday. "When I farmed on the North Platte 20 years ago, the place was black with buffalo, and often in looking over the level stretch of country for 20 miles, one could see little else. Now the great bison of the United States can only be found in museums or in parks and they have become quite a curiosity. The animals were slaughtered by the thousand just for their hides, when they should have been protected as the deer are in my native country, Germany. In Germany there are more deer grazing on the Government lands than there are in all the wild woods of the United States, and they have been

treated so well that they have become tame, being fed in the winter like domestic animals. The buffalo of this country should have been guarded in the same manner, as there are hundreds of thousands of acres of wild lands yet, upon which the animals could graze.

"The supply of salmon in the Columbia River may be patched up for a few years by propagation, but I cannot look forward to anything else than its final utter extermination."

Mr. Scherneckau believes Shaniko will be a good, lively town, so long as it remains the terminus of the railroad, and even after the road has been extended, the town will have a rich territory to draw from. He expects, however, to see the Columbia Southern extended southward so as to form a junction with the Corvallis & Eastern, which is bound to be carried eastward from its present terminus at the summit of the Cascades.

A Study in Comparative Values.

New York Journal of Commerce. A Republican victory will result in maintaining the gold-standard law of March 14, and it will probably result in the improvement of the National banking law. The election of Mr. Bryan and a House of Representatives of the same sort and the appointment of a man like Altgeld as Secretary of the Treasury, would result in the repeal of the gold-standard act, in opening the mints to free coinage of silver and in the payment of Government obligations in silver dollars without waiting for the opening of the mints. The Kansas City platform promises to retire all bank circulation and re-

place it with silver certificates and with Government paper, which, in the nature of the case, would be flat money, irredeemable paper. Now, whatever any man thinks of the Spanish War and its results, the past cannot be undone, and there is no important particular in which the present situation would be changed by substituting Mr. Bryan for Mr. McKinley. But on the currency the full programme of the destructive elements of the country could and would be carried out. If Mr. Bryan can be elected he will have a majority in not only the House but the Senate on the day he takes the oath of office. There is not a man of business in the East, and scarcely one in the West and South, who does not know that Mr. Bryan's election would precipitate a panic, contract the currency by retiring all gold, throw all commerce into chaos, and, as a calamity to the country, surpass drought, pestilence and even invasion by a foreign foe.

Electric Power in the Navy.

The cautious experiment of electrically driven turret-turning machinery on the Brooklyn, of chain ammunition hoists on the Puritan, the system of blowers and exhausters on the Wilmington, have all been grouped on the Kearsarge and Kentucky. These two battleships have more of their auxiliary machinery driven by electric power than any other warships afloat. These battleships represent the intermediate stage between steam and electrically driven auxiliary machinery, and show results in economy of coal.
