UNDER WATER 15 MINUTES.

Revived After Being Submerged for a Quarter of an Hour.

Philadelphia Record. After being submerged in 30 feet of water for 15 minutes, and then being pulled out unconscious, and almost dead, 13-year-old James Woodward, a sailor of the British steamer Belgienland, was last evening miraculously resuscitated through the combined efforts of the crew of the police tug Visitor, Police Surgeon Naylor and the physicians of the Pennsylvania Hospital.

The Belgienland has been lying at Washington-avenue wharf, and while working on deck last evening Woodward was so affected by the excessive heat that he became mentally deranged, tore his clothing off and jumped overboard. The spot where he plunged, because of its great depth, is known to rivermen as "Dead Man's Dive." Notwithstanding the fact that the water was so deep, Woodward sank with such force that he reached the bottom and stuck in the mud.

The crew of the Visitor, which was stationed near by, was notified, and the men immediately set to work with grappling irons to recover the body. It was 15 minutes before they found it, and when Woodward was brought on shore it was thought that he was dead. Nevertheless the harbor policemen began the usual methods of resuscitating partially drowned persons, and after an hour's hard work, in which they were reinforced by Surgeon Naylor, they were rewarded by seeing Woodward breathe and open his eyes. He was then hurried to the Pennsylvania Hospital, where he became so violent that it was found necessary to strap him to the bed. Although he is delirious, it is thought he will recover from his horrible experience.
