NO THOUGHT OF CHANGING PLACE OF 1902 CONVENTION.

National Officers Declare That There Is No Foundation for Story About Other Plans.

Two weeks ago it was reported in an Associated Press dispatch that the Na-tional officers of the Travelers' Protective Association of America had met at Indianapolls and discussed the project of changapolis and discussed the project of chains ing the place of the 1992 National meet-ing from Portland to some city in the Central West. Immediately upon receipt of this information Mr. A. N. Smith, president of the Oregon and Washing-ton division, placed himself in telegraphic communication with the National secre-tary at St. Louis. In reply Secretary La Beaume writes refuting the statement.

His letter is: St. Louis, Nov. 19.-A. N. Smith, President Oregon and Washington Division, Travelers' Protective Association of America, Portland, Or.—Dear Sir: I note in the Globe-Democrat of Monday a statement that at a meeting of the National officers of the Travelers' Protective Association of America at Indianapolis, the question of changing the place of the National meeting of the association from Portland to a meeting of the association from Portinant to a city in the Central West was discussed. I desire to state that this publication is absolutely false. There was a meeting at Indianapolis on Saturday last, at which President Jones, National Directors Crandall, McConkin and Saunders, Business Manager Burrows and the writer were present. This meeting was called to discuss a protest entered by the Indiana division in regard to the appointment of Mr. Burrows. The meeting convented at 2 o'clock in the afternoon and adjourned about 6:30. At no time during this meeting was the matter of time or place of holding the next National convention discussed, and I cannot understand how any such statement was published in the paper. I will state further, that the matter of changing the place of holding the convention has never been discussed at the board meetings. It is true that we have had some letters from parties regarding this matter, claiming that it was not a wise movement, but it has never been brought officially before the board, city in the Central West was discussed. I never been brought officially before the board, nor have they been requested to take any ac-tion in regard to the changing of the place of holding the convention. What little dissatis faction has been displayed has been simply an individual matter of the members.

In continuing his correspondence Mr. La Beaume says in his letter of November "You ask, can the National officers, if they desire to do so, make a change? I should say that they cannot make a change unless the city to which the convention was voted falls to perform their part of the agreement."
