STATE LOAN MADE MORE SAFE.

Bond Finds Land Valued Too High and Requires Payment of \$700.

SALEM, Feb. 1.—The State Land Board today received a re-payment of \$700 of the \$2500 loan recently made to H. A. Johnson on 32.5 acres of land near this city. This was the loan that was made the subject for considerable local political talk a few weeks ago. Johnson applied for a loan of \$2500 on the tract of land, and stated in his application that the area was 42.5 acres. M. W. Hunt, attorney for the board, examined the application and title to the land and certified that the land was of the actual cash value of \$700. He recommended the loan as a desirable one, and upon this recommendation the State Land Board made the loan. The loan was criticized by a paper which is making a political fight against Governor Geer, and the discussion brought out the fact that the area of the tract of land had been misrepresented. The rules of the board require that land offered as security shall have an actual cash value of three times the amount of the loan. The board immediately demanded that Johnson make good the loan comply with the rules, and the payment today was the result. The state now has \$1800 loaned on the 32.5 acres. The land lies near the State Fair Grounds near this city.

The loan, therefore, stands now upon a basis of an actual cash value of \$400, or \$172 per acre. The loan amounts to a little over \$2 per acre. From what can be learned, the board was probably misled as to the actual cash value of the land.

FINE BUILDINGS FOR SALE.

Three Property-Owners Will Help to Draw Business Up-Town.

SALEM, Feb. 1.—E. M. Croslan, John Hughes and J. P. Rogers have recently begun improving the corner of High and Ferry streets, and have mutually agreed to remove the old buildings, which have occupied the corners for many years, and to put up modern structures that will help to draw business in that direction. With the removal of the postoffice to Church street next summer, business will naturally move back further from the river, and numerous property-owners are preparing to take advantage of the improvement. The low cut in High and Ferry streets has been filed to bring the surface to the proper grade, and instead of being one of the poorest locations in the city, this corner will soon be one of the most businesslike. None of the property-owners could safely begin improvements alone, but the joint action of the three has accomplished the desired result and the city reaps the benefit.

Mr. Croslan has just broken ground for the largest and most up-to-date livery barn in the city. It will be 120 feet, and two stories high. The old dwelling-house which now occupies part of the property will be removed to a residence portion of the city.

JOHN DIAMOND DIES.

An Oregon Pioneer of 1847, for Whom Diamond Peak Was Named.

EUGENE, Or., Feb. 1.—Uncle John Diamond, one of the most respected pioneers of Lane County, died at Colburn today, at the home of William Delaney, with whom he had lived for years. He was 88 years old. Several weeks ago he was attacked with typhoid fever, to which his death was due. Deceased was born in Londonderry, Ireland, August 12, 1812. Sailing from Belfast April 14, 1833, he

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ARRASMITH NOT DECIDED

STILL DEBATING ACCEPTANCE OF GRAIN INSPECTORSHIP.
