ROTHSCHILD'S BACK OF IT

LENDING THEIR SUPPORT TO THE ROSEBERRY MOVEMENT.

The Bankers Said to Have Secured a Controlling Interest in the London Times.

LONDON, March 1.—To diagnose successfully the intentions and prospects of the new Liberal movement under the auspices of Lord Rosebery is to solve a puzzle which has every politician in Great Britain by the ears.

The remarkable attitude of the London Times, already noted in these dispatches, continues to such an extent that this United Kingdom is a half interest in the United Kingdom.

An explanation of this was afforded to the Associated Press by one of Lord Rosebery's fellow-workers, who is a personal friend of the ex-Premier, though opposed to him in politics. He said:

"I believe it is quite true that the Rothschilds own a half interest in the Times. We (the speaker is a member of the government) can no longer rely on the Times' support, and can only deduce that the Rothschilds intend to back Lord Rosebery's movement with all their millions and the other resources under their control."

Lord Rosebery's familiar connection with the Rothschilds, who have married Hannah de Rothschild, the eldest daughter and heiress of Baron Meyer de Rothschild, and their frequent outspoken distaste for the Rothschilds, is a well-known fact.

Important developments in the campaign are not likely to occur in the immediate future. It is understood that Lord Rosebery and his allied interests are willing to wait until the verge of the next election before issuing a definite programme.
