

DIES FROM OVERSTUDY

ADVENTIST COLLEGE STUDENT PASSES AWAY IN PORTLAND.

Lilford Enoch, of Corbett, Or., Aged Seventeen, Succumbs to Inflammation of the Brain.

After an attack of the grip and attempting to crowd two years' study into one, at Walla Walla College, Wash., so that he might graduate this summer with an ecclesiastic degree, Lilford Enoch, 17 years old, of Corbett, Or., died yesterday at a sanitarium on Second street from inflammation of the brain. He will be buried at 11 o'clock this morning, at Corbett. His is a sad story, of unceasing work and study, with little or no time for rest or recreation, with his life-work stopped just when his future seemed the fairest.

Young Enoch belonged to the Seventh-Day Adventists, and he was of an unusually religious turn of mind for a person of his years. His main object in life was to become a preacher of the gospel, and to this end he sacrificed everything. His brother George is a missionary in Trinidad, and the younger brother was likewise fired with missionary zeal.

ANSWER FATHER'S SUIT.

J. L. and A. Labovitch Deny They Owe Him Support.

In answer to the suit of Norris Labovitch for support, which is on once more before the County Court for answer, the sons, J. L. and A. Labovitch, yesterday filed an answer denying that he is entitled to anything at their hands, or that he is unable to provide for himself. They set forth in the answer that in 1888, in a suit which he commenced, their mother was granted a divorce from him on the ground of cruel treatment; that prior to the divorce he neglected to support his children and afterward abandoned them, going to Cleveland, where he married again, and where his wife now is. The sons further say in their answer that their mother was compelled to work to support, rear and educate them until they became old enough to earn their own livelihood, and that they heard nothing from their father until December, 1900, when he returned to Portland for the purpose of getting money from them. They assert that he is able to work and support himself and under the circumstances is estopped from claiming anything from them.
