New Belgian Treaty Ratified.
WASHINGTON, June 14.—Secretary Ha and Baron Moncheur, the Belgian Minister, today exchanged the final ratification of the new Belgian extradition treaty. This is one of the latest conventions which the department is drawing on modern lines with nearly all the countries with which we already have extradition treaties of rather ancient date. The crimes of larceny, kidnapping and obtaining money under false pretenses are added to the crimes already enumerated in the treaties.

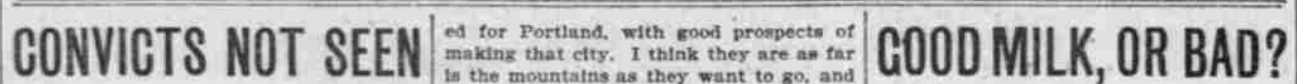
