UNIQUE OFFER BY PROMOTERS OF ROSE SHOW.

Most Interested Spectator Will Be Signally Honored—Other Features of Exhibition.

A new and rare feature has been announced in connection with the rose show to be given in Multnomah Field next Friday and Saturday. Official photographs will be taken of the display from various points of view, and a complete set of these will be given to the person who is decided to be the most interested spectator.

Exceptional interest is being taken in the floral parade to be given Saturday afternoon and a magnificent display is expected. Saturday evening there will be a band concert, on Friday afternoon and evening are left as the time when rose-lovers should feast their eyes upon the choice display of roses that will be at hand.

Members of the Portland Rose Society are busy working for the success of their coming exhibition, and report a gratifying response from the people generally. Heretofore the rose society has made no attempt to accumulate any reserve fund, but has given the proceeds of its shows to charity. At present it is desired to commence the accumulation of a fund in order that this society may be in a position to accomplish something noteworthy during the 1906 fair.

The roses will be displayed in a tent on Multnomah Field. The tent will be beautifully decorated and in the evenings the entire grounds will be illuminated with electric lights artistically arranged. The School of Domestic Science will have charge of the refreshments, and will use all of the skill in their special line to make this feature an attractive one and to prepare delicacies that will appeal to the most fastidious tastes. The prizes which will be awarded for the finest decorations in the floral parade were on exhibition yesterday in Feidenheimer's window, which was decorated with La France roses. The prizes are different variety roses will be used for the decoration of the window and a new one will be substituted every day until the parade. The prize awarded for the most interested spectator will undoubtedly create some interest and a great deal of enthusiasm. A committee of three ladies, whose names will not be known, but who will be in attendance throughout the entire show, will act as judges. The excessive number of questions usually asked at occasions like this will probably reach enormous proportions in the effort of the various candidates for the prize to make themselves seem truly interested.

No roses will be received before Friday morning, and at that time a committee of rose experts will be at hand which will give the proper name to each variety brought in. In this many visitors may be able to see what variety of rose they like best and decide what roses they wish to order for their own gardens. Tickets will be on sale at the usual places on Monday.

MONEY FOR BAND CONCERTS

Only Half Enough Money Raised—How to Get the Remainder.

PORTLAND, June 14.—(To the Editor.)—I have just been talking to the secretary of the Civic Improvement Association and looking over the list of members. One thing about it struck me very forcibly and that is, while firms and men who have large incomes are contributing in good shape, the men and women, too, whose incomes are not what you would call exorbitant, are joining. Now, that is a good sign. It shows that the general public is in sympathy with this movement and takes a pride and interest in the welfare of the city and that is as it should be. It is what counts in the long run. Nothing is going to succeed unless public sympathy is with it. I am an enthusiastic member of this association myself, and I find in talking with different men that most of them are right for it. Once in a while there are some good people whose sense of justice is abnormally developed, while their capacity for spontaneous action seems to be utterly atrophied, who virtuously proclaim that they have paid their taxes, and that the city should take hold of all these things. That is not often, however. But that is not what I started out to do.

The association by solicitation among the merchants of the city has secured a subscription of something like \$1200 toward band concerts in the parks this Summer. About twice that sum is required. As I said before, the citizens of modest income is willing to come in and aid in these things. All that is needed is to put the matter before them, and this is especially for the pleasure of the people. The concerts will be given if they are given—both on the west and east sides of the river, and I believe if the men in the city who employ a good many clerks or have dry goods stores, railroad offices and wholesale establishments, would put the matter before their employees they could very easily collect two-hits from each one. In fact, I think they would be glad to help it along. Can't the Oregonian put this forward? If it is pushed I feel confident the amount can be made up inside of two weeks. Try it; the wage-earner is no pauper. He is willing to pay a reasonable sum for his pleasures, and surely two-hits for a whole Summer of concerts is not unreasonable. CITIZEN.
