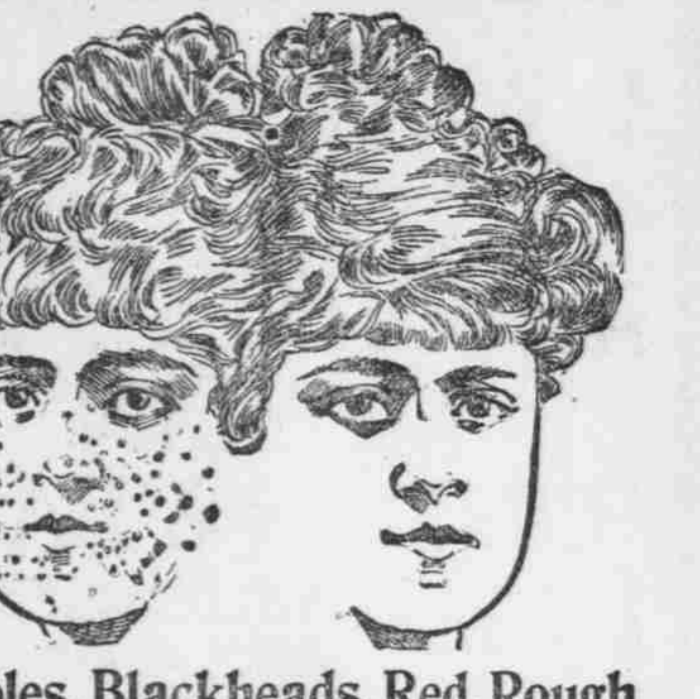
GOSS AND EWING WIN
