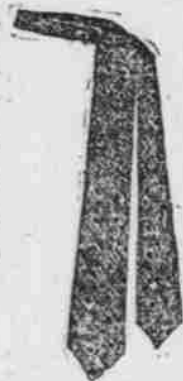

England's Active Old Men.

St. James's Gazette. Dean Bradley, the oldest of the group of public men who have stepped down from their pedestals during the past few weeks, is 80, but many famous men in the church are older than he, and Lord Salisbury has

a dozen years to live before he reaches the age at which Mr. Gladstone laid down the reins. Lord Salisbury is 77 next month, but he is still vigorous enough to be drawing one of the highest salaries in the empire, and presiding over the sittings of the House of Lords. Lord Roberts is 70,

but nobody but Dame Rumor suggests that he is not active enough to command the British Army, and Dame Rumor is likely to be a lying jade for some time longer. One finds much the same thing in the navy. Only one of the five Admirals of the fleet is far from 70, and Sir Harry

Keppel is the youngest of them all at 58— young enough to have paid a call the other day on the Sultan of Johore in his own palace. Dr. Temple, archbishop of Canterbury, at 81, is young enough to crown the King; and his brother York, but five years

younger, showed no sign of old age in crowning the Queen. Half the Generals in the war were men whose best years had long since gone—Lord Roberts, Sir George White, Sir Redvers Buller, Sir Charles Warren, and Generala Clerly, Coke and Kelly-Kenny are all over 60. Half the

things the world is talking about today is the work of the veterans. It is Sir John Aird, verging on 70, who has built the great Nile dam. It is Lord Masham, verging on 80, who appeals to the government to overhaul our fiscal system. The men over 70 in Parliament could not be counted on both

hands. Even Mr. Chamberlain is more than half-way through the 90c in four years, before the legal life of the Cabinet is over; he will have reached the age at which man's work is supposed to be done. Who can believe that the editor of Truth is an old man of 70?
