BIG CROWD TURNS OUT AT AKRON

Foraker Says Republicans Will Not Hamstring Country's Business to Please Anybody—Tariff Revision and Cuban Relief Favored.

AKRON, O., Sept. 27.—The Republicans of Ohio opened their state campaign here today. Secretary Root, Senators Foraker and Hanna, Governor Nash and General Dick, chairman of the state executive committee, arrived shortly before 1 o'clock. The parade this afternoon was participated in by clubs and delegates from almost every city in Northern and Central Ohio.

MONTANA DEMOCRATIC NOMINEE FOR CONGRESS

John M. Evans, of Missoula, the Democratic nominee for Congress in Montana, has lived in that state from his childhood. He was born at Sedalia, Mo., in 1863, and two years later moved with his family to Virginia City, Mont. After spending a short time at the West Point Academy, he went to the University of Missouri, from which he graduated in the law class of 1887. He formed a law partnership in Butte with the late W. H. De Witt, former chairman of the Republican State Committee, and in 1898 moved to Missoula, which city has been his home ever since. He has been elected to several offices without regard to party, and was for five successive years Police Magistrate. He was then appointed Register of the Missouri and Montana land offices in Cleveland. He has been president of the Missoula Board of Trade, president of the City School Board, and is now a member of the State Board of Education. He is a leader among the Masons and Knights of Pythias of his state.

PAID LARGEST PREMIUM. Check for More Than a Quarter of a Million on Life Insurance Policy.

Denver Republican. The largest premium ever paid on a life insurance policy in the history of the insurance business is on record. It is \$250,150, and was paid by Eben Smith, one of the best known men in Colorado, and the West, for a policy of \$50,000. Mr. Smith paid the money to the Mutual Life Insurance Company of New York, through an agent of the company in Denver. The \$250,150 includes the premiums and all the payments on it during the life of Mr. Smith. By paying the entire amount, Mr. Smith gains, but should he die, his investment would mean a loss of over \$100,000. Mr. Smith is hale and hearty. The last policy makes Mr. Smith's holdings in the Mutual Life Insurance Company over \$500,000.

There are policies held for larger amounts, but there never has been a premium paid on a policy calling for as large a sum as \$250,000. Some of New York's richest men are policyholders for millions, but they pay the premiums as they come due, so Mr. Smith has the distinction of paying the largest premium in the history of the world.

He has been more than 30 years of active business life retired a short time ago. He disposed of a good many of his interests in Colorado and purchased a home in Los Angeles. There he intended to spend seven months of the year. Early in 1867 Mr. Smith came to Colorado from California. He engaged in mining in Gilpin County and became associated with Jerome B. Chaffee, Colorado's first United States Senator.

He gained the largest part of his fortune at Cripple Creek. With Mr. Moffat he controlled the Victor mine, the Golden Cycle and other valuable properties. The Florence & Cripple Creek railroad was one of his pet projects and he carried it successfully to completion. Mr. Smith has been interested in numerous other enterprises and is a very wealthy man.

How to Escape a Danger. New York Times. According to the reporting, three of the six Senators whom the President has called in conference on the tariff question are substantially agreed that the tariff should be revised by placing on the free list articles the cost of producing which is less in this country than it is abroad. These three Senators are Messrs. Spooner of Wisconsin, Allison of Iowa, and Lodge of Massachusetts.

Undoubtedly this is sound reasoning from the needs of the country and from the express declarations of the later Republican National platforms. Nothing could be plainer than that this principle fixes exactly the level at which the tariff ceases to be protective to American industries and becomes oppressive to many of them and repulsive to the domestic and foreign trade of the Union.

We believe that this principle accords with the convictions of Mr. Roosevelt as early formed, convictions which he has deemed it expedient in the recent past to hold in the background, but which

apply with great force and directness to the actual situation of his party and of his country. If he is prepared to assume the leadership of his party on the line of this principle, we think that he can count on the support of a large majority of its members, and that he will have the greatest peril the party has faced in 30 years.

The Otago. Milwaukie Sentinel. The ottagi, the strange animal a short time ago discovered in Central Africa by Sir Harry Johnston, is now thought to have been known to the ancient Egyptians. The old monuments show a so-called "lion of set," a desert quadruped variously supposed to have been a fox, a muskrat, a dog, a camel and even a fabulous animal. A study of the pictures convinces Professor Wiedeman that the creature was the ottagi, which early hunters exterminated in Egypt.
