In 1892 he was re-elected Superior Judge for a full term, and four years later he was a candidate for re-election, but like the rest of the Republican candidates of that year, was engulfed in the Populistic wave which swept over the state. On retiring from the bench he resumed the practice of law at Mount Vernon. The political game had such strong attractions for the Governor that he continued to be a powerful factor in the councils of his party, and in 1900 was recognized as a desirable candidate for Lieutenant.
