Favorable Showing by Secretary of War.

ARMY EXPENSES LIGHTER

Material Reduction Also in Figures for River and Harbor Improvements, Though This May Be Changed.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—Secretary Root has just completed his estimates for the next fiscal year...

The estimates for the military establishment, which include all items for the support of the Army and the military academy, show a net reduction of \$21,522,221 from the estimates for 1902.

The increase of \$2,000,000 for barracks and quarters is due to resumption of work on new and reconstruction of many of the old posts, rendered necessary by the increase in the regular troops.

An increase of \$2,000,000 will be required in order to provide a full year's supply of clothing and equipment during the next fiscal year.

The estimate under the head of "public works," shows a decrease of \$3,778,770, as compared with the estimates for 1902 and of \$4,407,988, as compared with the amounts appropriated for 1901.

There is a decrease of \$15,653,821 in the estimate for river and harbor improvement under the Chief Engineer; \$1,985,855 for buildings and grounds at the military academy, and \$10,141 for buildings and grounds at Washington.

The estimate for the purchase of munitions for target practice and for the accumulation to meet emergencies, which must be anticipated.
