

HURRICANE AT SEA

Perilous Experience of the China Liner Indravelli.

TWO DAYS OF ROUGH WEATHER

Decks Swept by Continuous Seas, Boats Smashed and Cabins Flooded—No Loss of Life—Ship Brings Heavy Cargo.

The Portland & Astoria liner Indravelli, Captain Craven, has arrived after the roughest passage of any steamer of the company since the line was started. For two days she was virtually at the mercy of the elements and though she was somewhat battered up, she came through without any loss of life.

The storm really began on Sunday, February 8, when the Indravelli encountered a heavy sea. The wind veered to whole-gale proportions on the following morning. A sea mountain-high was running and immense quantities of water were shipped. Time and again heavy waves swept the ship's deck fore and aft.

With all the damage done, there were no serious casualties. Several sailors were knocked down and bruised by the seas that tore along the decks and the 14 Japanese and four Chinese passengers in the stateroom were made deathly sick.

Out from Hong Kong the Indravelli got into a strong northeast monsoon, with fog for two days and heavy rain on the 23d, reached Kobe on the 30, sailed on the 5th and arrived at Yokohama the next day, where she remained for two days in port.

The Indravelli brings a large cargo, most of which is matting. The hatches were opened and the cargo was examined by nightfall good progress had been made in the work of discharging her.

FEBRUARY GRAIN EXPORTS.

Venture of the Month Were Heavy Shipment to Australia and Africa.

Grain exports in February do not make as favorable a showing as in the same month in the two preceding years. The total shipments, food reduced to wheat measure, were 107,127 bushels, as compared with 1,675,325 bushels in February, 1901, and 1,570,998 bushels in the same month in 1902.
