

PLAY WAITING GAME

Contending Forces on Wabash Make Forced Truce.

NATURE OF THE GRIEVANCES

Chairman of Conductors Says Work Was Added Without Additional Pay—Strike Will Be Confined to Wabash Road, if Possible.

ST. LOUIS, March 7.—"We are working on the answer to the injunction," said Judge Irwin, chief counsel for the Wabash employees.

"We are waiting for the answer to the injunction," said President Ramsey, of the Wabash.

This epitomizes the situation and covers the two centers of interest in the present difficulty between the grievance committee representing the firemen and trainmen and the Wabash Railroad.

Calm Before Storm. All of this is the pending calm before the storm, as it is generally conceded that, in case the action of the court dissolves the injunction, a strike will be declared.

"Suppose that, pending the final decision of the court on this injunction, there are any matters connected with the question at least between the company and its employees which they want to settle, are you willing to meet them regardless of the injunction?"

"Certainly," replied Mr. Ramsey. "As I have stated before, I do not consider the injunction proceedings as interfering with any settlement of the company and its employees in the way of settling the questions now at issue, or any other question, and I am ready at any time to meet any committee of employees and settle supposed grievances that can be adjusted between us."

"What will be your next move in case the injunction is dissolved and a strike is ordered?"

"There will be but one thing to do in such an event," he replied, "and that will be to fill or endeavor to fill all places made vacant by strikers, and go on with the conduct of the traffic on the Wabash Railroad."

Nature of the Grievance. John Hopkins, chairman of the general committee of the railway conductors, has made a written statement detailing the grievances held by the Wabash employees. It is as follows:

The real grievance is not a case of wages. A violation of the old schedule is one of the causes of complaint. This is done by the company putting on preferred runs regular without additional pay. The next was 10 miles, each way, added to the St. Louis merchandise run, making 20 miles in the round trip additional with an increase of about \$3 per month.

The first of these was that crews on Detroit and Chicago runs, after running 20 miles, switch out the merchandise and take it down town without additional pay.

CRUISER CHATTANOOGA LAUNCHED AT ELIZABETH.

Steel Vessel With Modern Guns and Equipment Christened by Daughter of Chattanooga's Mayor.

NEW YORK, March 7.—In the presence of 8000 spectators, including officials of the State of Tennessee, the City of Chattanooga, the City of New York and many naval officers, the United States cruiser Chattanooga was launched today at the shipyards of the United States Shipbuilding Company.

The launch was christened by the young daughter of the Mayor of Chattanooga, Lillian Chambers, who broke a bottle of champagne against the prow with the words: "I christen thee, good ship, in honor of Chattanooga."

During the return trip on the special steamer speeches were made in the saloon by Governor Fraser, of Tennessee; Mayor Chambers, of Chattanooga; Senators Bate and Carmack, Lewis Nixon and Lyman J. Gage.

Great precaution had to be taken in launching the Chattanooga, because there was only 50 feet of water in front of the ways, and the cruiser is more than 50 feet long.

The Chattanooga is a steel-steel protected cruiser. The sheathing is of Georgia pine. Her length over all is 326 feet 8 inches and 20 on the low water line.
