MOODY ON THE DOLPHIN

President Will Review the Squadron Tomorrow.

THE PROGRAMME FOR TODAY

Roosevelt and Family Will Attend Regular Services on Kearsarge—Superintendent Brownson is a Guest of the President.

Oyster Bay, Aug. 15.—The North Atlantic fleet came to anchor in the sound of Lloyd's Neck Point at sundown tonight, and lies in four long lines reaching east and west for 200 yards. It is here to be reviewed by President Roosevelt Monday. The fleet left Bar Harbor at noon Wednesday in a fog which lasted about ten hours. Orders had been issued by Rear-Admiral Barker, the commander-in-chief, that the fleet, in case of separation, should rendezvous in Gardiner's Bay. The battleships and the cruisers did become separated, but joined again at Nantuxet.

While anchored in Smithtown Bay the Dolphin, with Secretary of the Navy Moody on board, passed and was saluted. The Dolphin arrived here about the middle of the afternoon and the Mayflower and the Sylph fired the salute of the Secretary of the Navy. Secretary Moody is the guest of the President at Sagamore Hill tonight.

The disposition of the fleet is that the first squadron, consisting of the flagship of Rear-Admiral Barker, the Kearsarge, and the battleships Illinois and Alabama, making the first division, anchored in the middle of the afternoon and the Mayflower and the Sylph fired the salute of the Secretary of the Navy. FEWER TO PAY STRIKE TAX.

National Building Trades Council Changes Its Constitution.

DENVER, Aug. 15.—At the session of the National Building Trades Council today an important change was made in the constitution affecting the per capita assessment for strike and lockout benefits. Heretofore, such assessment was levied upon the total membership of all National and international locals affiliated with the council. Under the change, this assessment will be limited to unions which are affiliated with the local councils that are members of the National Building Trades Council.

J. H. Sheldon, who is the purchasing agent for the Astoria salmon combine, has shipped 30 tons, and about 25 tons have been purchased by other parties. The output was considerably augmented by the catches at the Willows sealing ground, a few miles above St. Helens. Mr. Sheldon, who managed the sealing grounds this season, reports a catch of 100 tons a day. This was something unusual, and was not an average catch by any means. A dozen years ago the output of salmon at this point was a minimum amount, and small shipments only were made of outside markets. With the advent of outside purchasers, the fishermen were provided with better facilities for taking fish until this has become one of the best fishing points on the river. Some of the small fish boats are now provided with gasoline engines, which enables them to do more effective work.

WRIGHT IS UMPIRE.

Ex-Labor Commissioner to Act in Local Miners' Dispute. SCRANTON, Pa., Aug. 15.—T. D. Nichols, secretary of the miners' conciliation board, today received a telegram from Judge Gray, of Wilmington, Del., notifying him that he had appointed Carroll E. Wright, ex-United States Commissioner of Labor, and member of the Anthracite Strike Commission, umpire of the board. Mr. Wright will probably meet with the board at Portsville next Thursday. The conciliation board several days ago recommended Judge Gray to appoint an umpire, as provided for in the award on the strike commission.

FRAUD IN CITY OFFICE.

New York Has Lost \$1,000,000 in Water Department. NEW YORK, Aug. 15.—Evidence of fraud, by which the city has lost sums aggregating almost \$1,000,000, has been obtained by Water Commissioner Monroe. Three inspectors in the water department are under suspicion. One probably will be called upon to face charges within a few days. The facts disclosed are said to show gross carelessness, if not worse, on the part of many trusted employees of the water department. In some cases there is the strongest circumstantial evidence of collusion between consumers of water and employees of the department, whereby the former apparently have been allowed to use all the water they required in their business and, on the payment of merely nominal fees, instead of the price fixed by ordinance.

TRAINMEN GET MORE WAGES.

OMAHA, Neb., Aug. 15.—The joint committee representing the engineers and firemen of the Union Pacific Railway today concluded a conference with Superintendent of Transportation Buckingham and Master of Motive Power McKee, the result of which is an advance of wages for the engineers of about 3% and for the firemen of 4% per cent. The increase runs from 10 to 20 cents a hundred miles for the engineers, with proportionate increases for the firemen. The negotiations have been pending since July 6, and the new scale affects the entire system.
