HOW TO STOP HOLD-UPS

Advantages of Law Making Felony of Carrying Concealed Weapons.

ALBANY, Or., Aug. 28.—(To the Editor.)—I notice that in a recent issue of The Oregonian a correspondent criticizes my suggestion that all persons carrying concealed weapons should first be required to secure a license therefor upon a recommendation of six reputable citizens.

This correspondent does so on the ground that highwaymen carry guns, law or no law; that if there are persons who have sufficient vertebrae to carry and use them, they will do so. One of these highwaymen, and that it would be better to make prison life harder and more serious.

Your correspondent, although he signs his name "Lawyer," seems to have utterly overlooked the reason of my suggestion. My suggestion was to make it a felony punishable by imprisonment in the penitentiary for carrying concealed weapons without a license therefor. You say that the law has a tendency to prevent reputable citizens from carrying concealed weapons for self-defense. It would not. I think that when a burglar enters the house of another armed with a deadly weapon in the night time, for the purpose of committing a felony therein, and a murder, it is not necessary to get satisfaction by punishing the criminal after he has accomplished the deed.

Making prison life harder for the man who takes you to law would do you but little good. The suggestion that they will carry guns, law or no law, is untenable. While the law might be violated sometimes, the fact is that a man knows that the penalty for carrying a gun in his face is to be found in the penitentiary. A deadly weapon without a license therefore, he will be very careful not to be found in that condition. Such a law would give the authorities a power over the criminal classes which they could not obtain in any other way.
