AYS LOW WILL WIN

New York Herald Canvass Gives Him 13,000 Lead.

TAMMANY IS VERY CONFIDENT

Leader Murphy Declares McClellan Will Be Chosen Mayor of Greater New York by a Handsome Majority.

NEW YORK, Oct. 31.—The Herald, which has been taking a secret ballot, forecasts a re-election of Mayor Low by a margin of 12,148 over George B. McClellan. The Brooklyn Daily Eagle's canvass of the probable vote in Greater New York in the coming election, based on returns received from about 25,000 voters, indicates that McClellan will carry the city by about 48,915 plurality.

Three days before the municipal election of 1906 well-informed men on either side of the struggle find themselves unable to predict the result of Tuesday's election. It seems probable that the result will be very close, and a few thousand votes will decide whether Seth Low or George B. McClellan will be Mayor.

All the leaders today issued estimates of large majorities for their tickets. Charles F. Murphy is confident of the election of the Democratic ticket by 100,000. M. Linn Bruce and E. Fulton Cutting declared that Low will be elected by about 22,000 as many as in 1901.

A Democratic majority in Manhattan is generally regarded as probable.

In Brooklyn the fusionists are making assertions of 40,000 majority, but it is known the more conservative estimates place it at 15,000 to 20,000.

Murphy has issued an estimate of 82,000 plurality in Manhattan, but it is said that he does not count on more than 35,000 to 38,000.

SALT LAKE CAMPAIGN BITTER

Mormons Charged With Taking a Hand, and Republicans Split.

SALT LAKE, Oct. 31.—The present municipal campaign has been one of the most hotly contested since the days of the old Liberal and Church parties. Charges that the Mormon church was taking an active part, and the defection of many Republican leaders, headed by National Committeeman Salsbury, have resulted in considerable bitterness and the largest registration ever known here. E. P. Morris, present County Recorder, is the Democratic candidate for Mayor. Frank Knox, a banker, heads the Republican ticket.

SAN FRANCISCO BATTLE ENDS

Three-Cornered Fight for Mayor Absorbs All Interest.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 31.—The municipal campaign which closed here tonight has been one of unusual interest, as under the charter recently adopted, the Mayor of San Francisco has extraordinary power, and will have the appointment of commissions which will direct the expenditure of \$13,000,000 for the improvement of the city.

Three candidates for Mayor are in the field. The Republicans have nominated Henry J. Crocker, a wealthy business man, who claims to represent the business interests of the city. The Democrats have nominated Franklin K. Lane, an

REPUBLICANS LEAD IN OHIO.

Democrats Lay No Claim to Anything Save Legislature.

CINCINNATI, Oct. 31.—The election Tuesday is for a full state ticket and members of the Legislature that selects a successor to United States Senator Hanna. The Republicans have brought into the campaign many prominent speakers, including Senators and Congressmen from other states, but no unusual interest was manifested except at the meetings of Hanna, who has been a greater drawing card than ever before. With the exception of Bryan, the Democrats have had very few prominent men on the stump.

None of the old leaders in Ohio or from other states participated. The indications are that Johnson will get most of the Socialist vote, which was over 11,000 last year, but it is doubtful if the whole of that vote would equal his Democratic losses. All predictions are that the Republicans will elect their state ticket by a large plurality, and the only claim of the Democrats is for the Legislature.

At Cleveland, where the candidates for Governor and Senator live, the result is in doubt.

Democrats Claim Maryland.

BALTIMORE, Oct. 31.—The campaign in Maryland, which closed tonight, was almost unprecedented in the history of the state for enthusiasm and partisan activity.

John R. Hanna, chairman of the Republican State Central Committee, in a formal statement today, said he would not give any figures.

Murray Vandiver, chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee, says the Democrats will carry the state by 15,000 majority and ought to have 80 members of the Legislature on joint ballot.

STILL THE DOCUMENT IS UGLY
