**How Best to Help the Needy.**—The City Board of Charities has just issued 3000 little folders whose subject is "How Best to Help the Needy." The board urges the public to report all cases of poverty to the organization and in this way claims that it can rid the city of tramps and render the necessary assistance to the deserving poor. Thousands of cards have also been distributed throughout the city for the use of persons to whom applications are made for assistance. The card bears the name of the board and the office address and instructs the bearer to apply at the office if in need. The worthless tramp will not apply to the Board of Charities for assistance because he knows that this means work or no remuneration. If persons to whom the needy apply will give these cards to the applicants and refer them to the City Board of Charities, the board thinks that it can give the city's poor all the necessary assistance.

**NEW HOTEL TO BE BUILT**

ASTORIA CAPITALIST PROMISES TO ERECT BIG HOSTELRY.

W. W. Whipple Announces He Has Selected Central Site for Structure of 250 Rooms.

Six hundred thousand dollars will be the cost of a new 250-room hotel to be built in the center of the business district of Portland within the very near future. W. W. Whipple, an Astoria capitalist, will build the new hotel and promises to have the hotel ready for business before the Lewis and Clark Fair commences in 1936.

Mr. Whipple has been in the city since Friday evening looking over the city and states that he has already secured a site for the new building. The location, however, Mr. Whipple refuses to tell, except that it is in the business section of the city and is as conveniently located as any of the other hotels.

From foundation to roof Mr. Whipple promises that the new structure shall be strictly first-class and states that the new building will be a decided credit to Portland. The number of rooms has not yet been decided upon as several sets of plans submitted to Mr. Whipple are still under his inspection and no definite selection has as yet been made. The new hotel will be a strictly first-class hotel, up to date in every way and will be provided with every modern convenience.

Mr. Whipple has no fear of a reaction after the Centennial, but says that there will be plenty of business for several more as well as his own hotel even after the Fair is over. He will leave here this morning for Tacoma and will shortly depart from Tacoma for New York. He has for years been one of the leading business men of Astoria and is at the present time president of the Palace Catering Company, of Astoria. He also has extensive holdings in the Mutual Lumber Company, of Buena Vista, Wash.
