

UNITS OF '05 BILL

Senators Will Prove Interest by Votes.

FULTON MAKES A CANVASS

He Is Satisfied the Measure Will Be Little Changed.

HALE'S WORDS SIGNIFICANT

When He Said He Did Not Propose to Be the One Man to Lead a Forlorn Host, He Knew Whereof He Spoke.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Feb. 6.—Developments in Congress this week have greatly encouraged members of the Oregon delegation to look forward to favorable action on the Lewis and Clark Centennial bill. Senator Fulton, who has just closed a canvass of the Senate, which included every member of that body now in Washington, believes the bill will pass the upper branch of Congress in substantially the shape it was reported. In all his interviews with Democrats, as well as Republicans, he failed to find any adverse sentiment worth mentioning. True, a few Senators think the bill should be amended in some particulars, but Senator Fulton does not expect to sacrifice much more than the provision for the memorial building, and a reduction in the number of National Commissioners from seven to three.

Friends of the Lewis and Clark bill take great heart from a statement made by Senator Hale a few days ago during the consideration of the Louisiana Purchase loan amendment. He was asked if he expected to oppose the Portland bill when it came up, and replied he was not particularly fond of leading a parade when he himself had to be the entire procession. This remark from a man so well acquainted with the sentiment of the Senate as Hale is known to be is construed as meaning that the Lewis and Clark bill will meet with little or no opposition when it does come up.

The Oregon Senators are planning to call their bill up as soon as the Panama discussion comes to a close, and are constantly in attendance, ready to avail themselves of any opportunity that may be afforded in the meantime. They do not expect their bill to lead to protracted debate; in fact, rather hope to see it pass in a single day.

There has been little change in the situation in the House during the week. Through a series of adverse circumstances the House committee was prevented from referring the Lewis and Clark bill to a subcommittee, but probably do so on Monday. This committee will hardly consider the bill for more than a week, but will unquestionably trim down the measure to about the shape demanded by the House leaders. It is thought the bill which finally becomes a law will very closely conform to the bill that eventually comes from the House committee.

FINISH PLANS FOR CONVENTION

Republicans Select Men to Execute Them and Adjourn.

CHICAGO, Feb. 6.—The subcommittee of the National Republican Committee, which has been making preliminary preparations for the National Republican Convention, to be held at Chicago June 21, concluded its work today and adjourned. Committee members Harry S. New, of Indianapolis; R. B. Schneider, of Nebraska; and W. F. Stone, of Maryland, sergeant-at-arms of the National Committee, will meet again in Chicago about May 20, continuing at work until after the convention has adjourned.

The subcommittee spent most of the day in discussion of the seating arrangements of the Coliseum, and the convention will be held. On the projection of the platform, near the speakers, will be seats for the chairman of the National Committee, the chairman of the convention, the secretary of the convention and the sergeant-at-arms. Back of them, on a platform elevated 4 feet, come the 51 members of the National Committee. Back of the committee has been arranged an incense with 400 seats for distinguished guests, party leaders, etc.

My friends have taken the matter into their own hands, and without informing me, have elected me. General Reyes said he would leave on Tuesday on the Kaiser Wilhelm der Gross to go to Paris direct. He would not tell more about his trip, except that he may go from that place to Colombia. General Reyes, in speaking of the canal matter, said he wished to further the construction of the canal as far as he could, consistently with the honor of Colombia. Matters now were at a standstill, he said."

GERMAN TROOPS SURROUNDED

Tribesmen in South Africa Continue Aggressive Campaign.

BERLIN, Feb. 6.—The Koloniale Zeitung has received a telegram from Windhoek, German Southwest Africa, stating that the Omaruru Company proceeded to Omaruru via Karibib, and stormed that place on February 4. An extraordinary energetic resistance was offered to the attack. The Germans lost four killed and 12 wounded, while seven were reported missing. The company is now surrounded by the enemy, but 400 Germans are immediately sent back to the relief of the Omaruru Company.
