

MAY HAVE SUNK OWN SHIPS. St. Petersburg Believes Russians

ST. PETERSBURG, Doc. 10 .- The state-ST. PETERSBURG, Dec. 10.—The state-ment that the Russian warships at Port Arthur were sunk by the Russians as a protection from the Japanese gun fire is regarded at the Admiralty as being quite possible. If true, it is interpreted as a sign that General Stoessel believes the fortrees can hold out until the arrival of the second Pacific squadron. The supposition is that the garrison, as a last resort, will retire to the Liao Ti forts.
