62,000 BUSHELS IN THE LOT

COLFAX, Wash., Dec. 10.—(Special.)—The largest sale of wheat by a single firm, ever made in Whitman County, has just been made by Lillis F. Smith, the "wheat king," of the Palouse country...

That year crops were good and prices high the price of wheat ranging from 65 cents to 85 cents. Mr. Smith had a crop of 30,000 bushels. Much of this was "volunteer" from seed wasted in harvest...

Mr. Smith is a prominent Republican, and served two terms as County Commissioner. He was the Republican nominee for Representative in 1902 but was defeated by a plurality of 97 votes...

PECULIAR CASE IN IDAHO. Division of Members of the Supreme Court in Different Aspects.

BOISE, Idaho, Dec. 10.—(Special.)—The Supreme Court in a peculiar case before it today, and in its decision three members of the court delivered two opinions and two dissents, there being separate divisions on each. The case was brought from Kootenai.

Justice Ralph T. Morgan, of that district, quashed the jury panel of that county because of alleged irregularities in its drawing. It was alleged that the County Commissioner did not select the names from the poll lists, as required by law...

Justice Stocklager and Allshie in their opinion held the proper method of bringing the case before the Supreme Court was writ of certiorari and from this the Chief Justice dissented. The legality of the proceedings of the County Commissioners was not touched upon in any of the oral opinions delivered.
