AILS A IS COMING FORWARD

Sighted by Steamer St. Paul May 23 and 24 With Ailsa, Atlantic.

Fleur de Lis and Valhalla Strung Out Behind.

LATEST POSITIONS OF YACHTS IN TRANS-ATLANTIC RACE.

The positions of the yachts in the great ocean race, when last sighted, were as follows: Hamburg, May 24, 11:30 A. M.—Latitude 42:15 north, longitude 44:25 west; 1357 miles east of Sandy Hook.

NEW YORK, May 27.—The German yacht Hamburg was leading the Ailsa by 13 miles, with the Atlantic, Fleur de Lis and the English clipper snip Valhalla strung out in that order astern, when the yachts were sighted on May 23 and 24 by the steamer St. Paul.

LONDON, May 27.—The American line steamer St. Louis, from New York, May 20, which passed the Lizard at 8:05 A. M. today, reported to the Associated Press by a Marconi wireless from Southampton, that she had passed successfully Monday, May 23, the schooner-yacht Endymion, the yawl Ailsa and schooner Hamburg, between 12:35 P. M. and 7:30 P. M.
