Hand-carved vases in endless designs and native artists at work with palette and brush are other features of interest. For the enjoyment of those seeking refreshments, the most delicious Formosa Oolong tea and dainty rice wa-

fers are served in the picturesque tea garden, presided over by a corps of bustling Japanese maidens, every patron receiving a souvenir package of this excellent tea. But to visit "Fair Japan" without dropping into the Japanese Theater is like visiting Rome without seeing the great Cathedral of St. Peter. In this theater is depicted not only the manners and customs of the Japanese people, but also their

national games and pastimes and romantic traditions. The Japanese drama is worth the consideration of every Fair visitor, and those who miss the Japanese Theater are missing a big part of the Fair. Among the performers are acrobats, jugglers, trapeze artists, and trained singers, the singing of one little troupe of 12 Sumo men alone being worth the low price of admission.

It is "Fair Japan" that gives the Trail an Oriental color, and the Exposition management is to be congratulated upon securing so valuable an exhibit. No charge is made for admission to this picturesque Oriental village, and only a small charge is made for admission to the theater.
