

GALLOWAY OUT FOR CONGRESS

McMinnville Democrat Seeks the Nomination for the First District.

ANNOUNCES HIS PLATFORM

Free Trade With the Philippines, and Tariff for Revenue Only Are Among the Doctrines He Upholds.

Declaring himself a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the First Oregon district, Charles V. Galloway, of McMinnville, yesterday announced the principles on which he will run. Two Democratic candidates have appeared in the district, the other being J. A. Cochran, of Woodburn, who has not yet proclaimed his platform. The Republican candidates thus far are W. C. Hawley, of Salem; S. B. Huston, of Hillsboro, and Walter L. Toomey, of Woodburn, each of whom has announced his platform.

Free Trade With Philippines. Mr. Galloway goes further than do the Republican candidates, in making known the principles on which he will run. In that he says he will work for free trade with the Philippines, for tariff revision, to the ultimate end that tariff shall be imposed for revenue only, and against the subsidy. In other respects his platform is similar to that of the Republican candidates. For example, he favors Chi-

and better service, deeper and better harbors, good without saying. It seems unnecessary to dwell long on National undertakings and Governmental principles that are approved generally by right-thinking people.

Completion of Panama Canal. The completion of the Panama Canal at the earliest date possible is a consummation desired by all of us; at least by all who are not under the influence of special interests antagonistic to that great enterprise.

Improved conditions and regulations to safeguard the interests of wage-earners are favored by all except those who may be beneficiaries of the absence of such conditions and regulations. Naturally, I favor the continued exclusion from this country of Chinese laborers. Similar laws should exclude all classes of foreigners who may be incapable of assimilating to our National life and are not competent for intelligent American citizenship.

The advantages to be derived from the extension and development of the rural-mail service are manifest. More routes, better pay for carriers and the establishment of rural mail routes (which I sincerely favor) will add greatly to the convenience and comfort of farm life.

The granting of liberal pensions to the veterans of our wars is, to my mind, not a "question" or a "problem." It is an act of justice, a course of National policy thoroughly approved.

The relations between shipper and common carrier are properly a subject for governmental supervision. The granting of additional powers to the Interstate Commerce Commission, so that, upon complaint of discrimination, it may determine, establish and enforce reasonable rates, is a broad-minded long approved by the Democratic party. The American Nation is to be congratulated that it has a President who is not only broad-minded enough to give his powerful support to a policy that leading Republican members of Congress have also supported.

But it is probable that this important measure will be passed and the issue determined long before the Representative to be elected in the First District next June shall take his seat in Congress. It therefore seems that the anxious efforts of certain candidates to "fall in line with the Administration" or to "avoid any discriminations from the consideration of this subject, might be directed with more of profit and of interest toward other matters.

What Mr. Galloway Says.

When asked for his platform yesterday, Mr. Galloway said:

In proper time my position on questions to be considered by the voters in selecting one for this office will be stated in candid and positive terms. There is no issue that I shall dodge or evade.

It does not appear necessary to offer now any protracted statement in the nature of a platform. I shall not discuss extensively on so-called "questions" regarding the material development and prosperity of the First district and of the state. These are propositions on which true Oregonians agree and discussion that presumes an opposition seems largely unnecessary.

Whether in private or in public capacity I shall continue to labor to the extent of my ability to promote the best interests of each and every part of our state. A good citizen should do no less.
