MOVES AGAINST THE DRUG TRUST

Government Attacks Alleged Merger to Fix Prices. SUIT IN INDIANA

WASHINGTON, May 9.—The Government today began prosecution of the alleged "drug trust," beginning proceedings in Indiana on the ground of a combination to fix prices to the consumer. Attorney-General Moody makes public this statement: "The Government today filed in the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Indiana petition for an injunction against certain associations, corporations and individuals, comprising what is commonly known as the 'drug trust' of the United States."

Who Defendants Are. "The Proprietary Association of America is an unincorporated association of 80 per cent of the manufacturers and proprietors of patent medicines, drugs and proprietary articles in the United States. The National Wholesale Druggists Association is also an unincorporated association composed of nearly all the wholesale druggists in the United States. These wholesale druggists act as the distributing agents for the manufacturers and proprietors of patent medicines, chemicals, drugs and proprietary articles, purchasing the same direct from the manufacturers, and supplying the same to the retail druggists in various parts of the country. The National Association of Retail Druggists is also an unincorporated association composed of delegates from affiliated local associations of retail druggists located in the various states of the United States, and it is claimed that this association, through its affiliations, has a membership of about 30,000, or nearly all the retail druggists in the United States who purchase and sell patent medicines, chemicals, drugs and proprietary articles to the consumer. Each of these three associations has officers who are made party defendants, as well as certain other individuals, firms and corporations who are members of the respective associations. There is but one ultimate object of the conspiracy, viz.: To fix the price which shall be observed by all retail druggists in selling to the consumer the various commodities manufactured by the several members of the proprietary association.

How Prices Are Regulated. "The plan by which such object is effected is in brief as follows: No retail druggist can obtain goods from a wholesale druggist or a manufacturer of a proprietary medicine unless such retail druggist becomes a member of the National Association of Retail Druggists, and in order to become such member, he must agree to observe the established price at which such proprietary medicines shall be sold to the consumer. An injunction is prayed for prohibiting these associations from acting in concert for the purpose of maintaining prices, and the individuals, firms and corporations who are members of the respective associations from acting together for the purpose of maintaining uniform prices to the consumers throughout the United States.
