 man of a committee to work toward that
 end. A committee, with C. Ben Hiesland
 chairman, was appointed to work for the
 betterment of the present streets and
 the improvement of sidewalks. A move-
 ment was also started to get out a book-
 let to advertise Woodstock. It will be
 issued through the agency of a local real-
 ty firm, and will contain many illustra-
 tions of the Woodstock district.

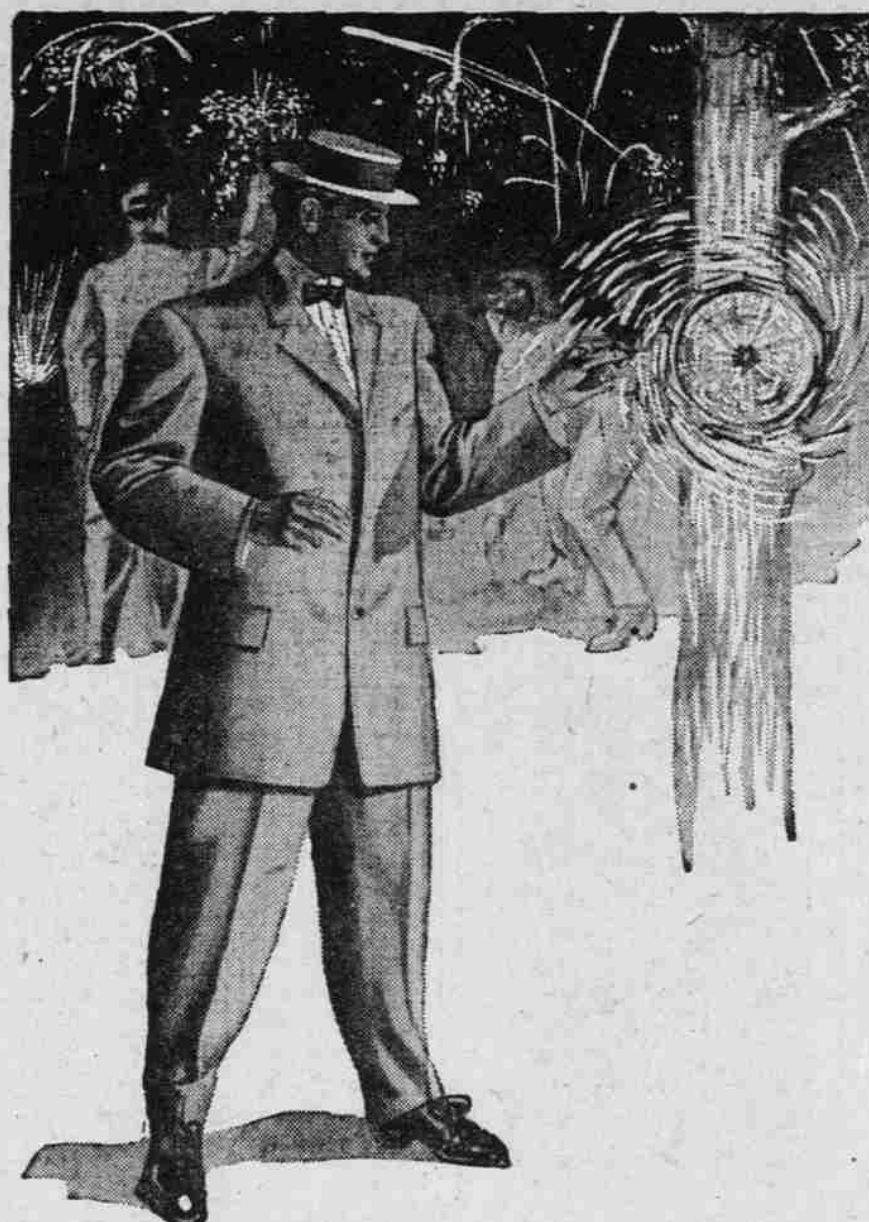
