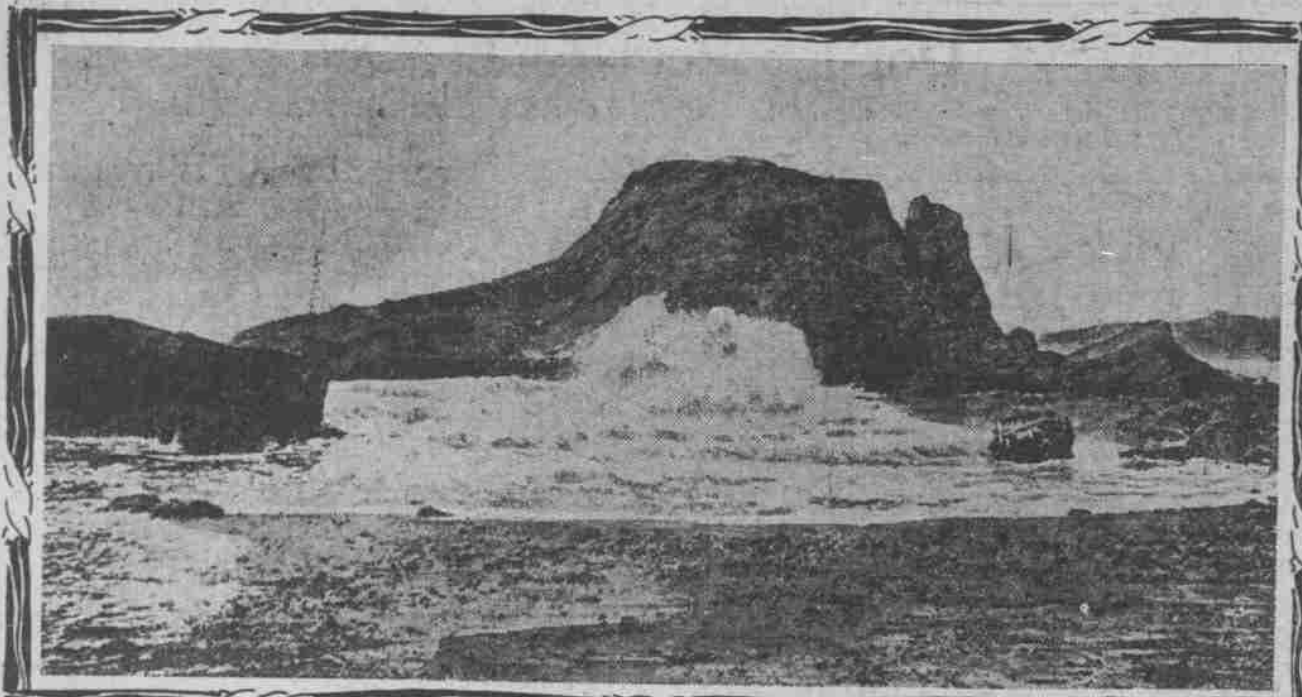
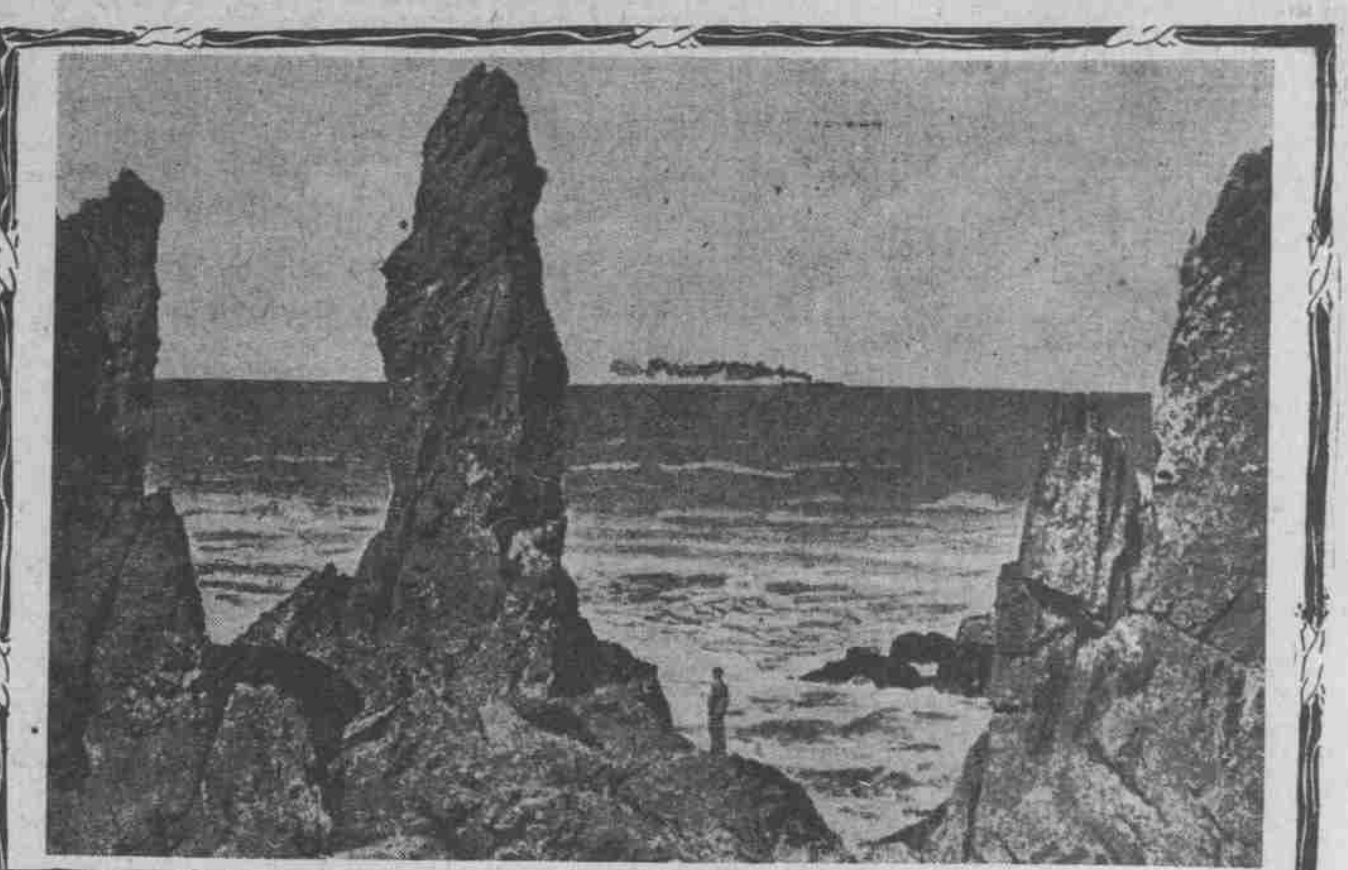


# BATHING AND EXCURSIONS ARE DIVERSIONS AT COAST RESORTS

NEWPORT, Or., Aug. 18.—(Special)—Glorious days of brilliant sunshine are still the order at this beautiful spot. A little rain last Sunday helped to lay the dust, although it dampened the enthusiasm of the hundreds of excursionists who came in from the Valley towns. The bathing during the week has been delightful, and the crowds seem to get larger and merrier every day. As the tide crowd stands around and makes sarcastic remarks as to the blueness of this or that person, or the shivery look of others, it makes one wish that some large wave would dash up and give them all a taste of the water that others enjoy so much.

The arrival of the boat from Yaquina is still the great event of every day, and the landing and the street fronting it are almost impassable at this time. The music of the band beguiles the waiting crowd, and keeps pilgrims from getting melancholy with the thoughts of home. Every morning sees the departure of large parties for the Big Trees, Otter Rock, Yaquina Lighthouse, Seal Rocks and many other points of interest. Campers are to be found in every available spot, and the darkness of the night is made picturesque by the gleam of the campfires and the sounds of popular song and ballad. The pieces of worship are splendidly filled on Sundays, the Episcopal Church, overlooking Yaquina Bay, being the Mecca for many visitors. The Roman Catholic Church is also open for mass.

Many pleasant things are being said about the excellence of the musical programme recently given by Miss Susie Pennell Pipes, violinist; Miss Eva Stinson, soprano, and Frederick W. Goodrich, pianist and accompanist, at Irvin House, Nye Creek. The audience was a large and enthusiastic one, and every number was well received. Mrs. Pipes played for the first time since her return from Europe, where she studied two years under eminent masters, and her work was splendid. It was also a real pleasure again to listen to Miss Stinson, who has now recovered from her recent illness, and her singing was charming. Mr. Goodrich's piano numbers were all that could be desired, those of his own composition showing both beauty and originality. The programme: Andante concerto in D (Vieuxtemps) and "Humoresque" (Dvorak), Mrs. Pipes; aria from "Faust" (Gounod), with violin obligato, song (Mansueti), Miss Eva Stinson; suite of dances from "Nell Gwyn" (German), and "Spanish March" and "Gracioso" (Goodrich), Mr. Goodrich.
