Two ballots were taken before the final choice was made. The announcement that a new general of the order has been chosen was communicated to the outer world by the ringing of a bell, which was the signal that the meeting was at an end.

Father Francis Xavier Wernz was born at Rothwell, Wurtemberg, on December 2, 1842, and at the age of 15 entered the society of which today he was chosen head.

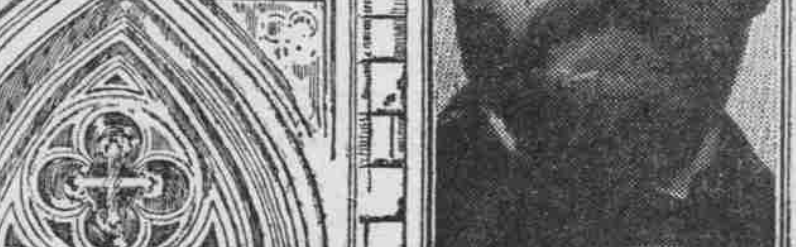
