In 1906 the total exports of raw cotton from the United States were 8,507,964 bales for \$379,945,104, but in 1906 America got \$401,000,000 for only 7,000,826 bales. A gain of 1,227,108 bales of cotton and \$21,040,917. The United States supplied Marshall, France, with 10,118,922 pounds of the 18-501,487 pounds of tobacco which that port received in 1905, according to a report made by Consul-General Skinner.
