

TALK ON WOMAN'S RIGHTS

Governmental Study Department of Woman's Club to Frame Bill.

In the rooms of Dr. John Carlyle yesterday, the government study department of the Woman's Club held a meeting of which a feature was an address, by the president, Mrs. Abigail Scott Duniway. It was followed by an animated discussion which took a wide animated discussion which took a wide range. The legal, civil and political rights of women and children were considered in many phases, from the different standpoints of different countries. Australia, New Zealand, Switzerland and Finland were among the nationalities whose laws were pronounced more favorable to the rights of women than those of "Free America."

Duniway described her visit to the historic grounds of Champoeg, May


