Gas Company Incorporates.—Capitalized at \$1,000,000, the Economy Gas Company was incorporated yesterday by E. E. Lytle, D. G. Tomasini and R. W. Colson. The new concern is backed by local capitalists and has for its object the laying of mains to engage in the saie of gas throughout Portland. At Monday's election an ordinance submitted for the purpose of assertatining the people's voice concerning a franchise for this company will be included on the bailot. The ordinance provides that \$5 cents per 1000 cubic feet will be the maximum price for gas, and that not less than \$5000 a year shall be spent for the maintenance of the plant. It also provides that \$5 cents per 1000 the city every year. The ordinance if approved will prevail for \$5 years, at the end of which period the city will have an option on the purchase of the plant.




