

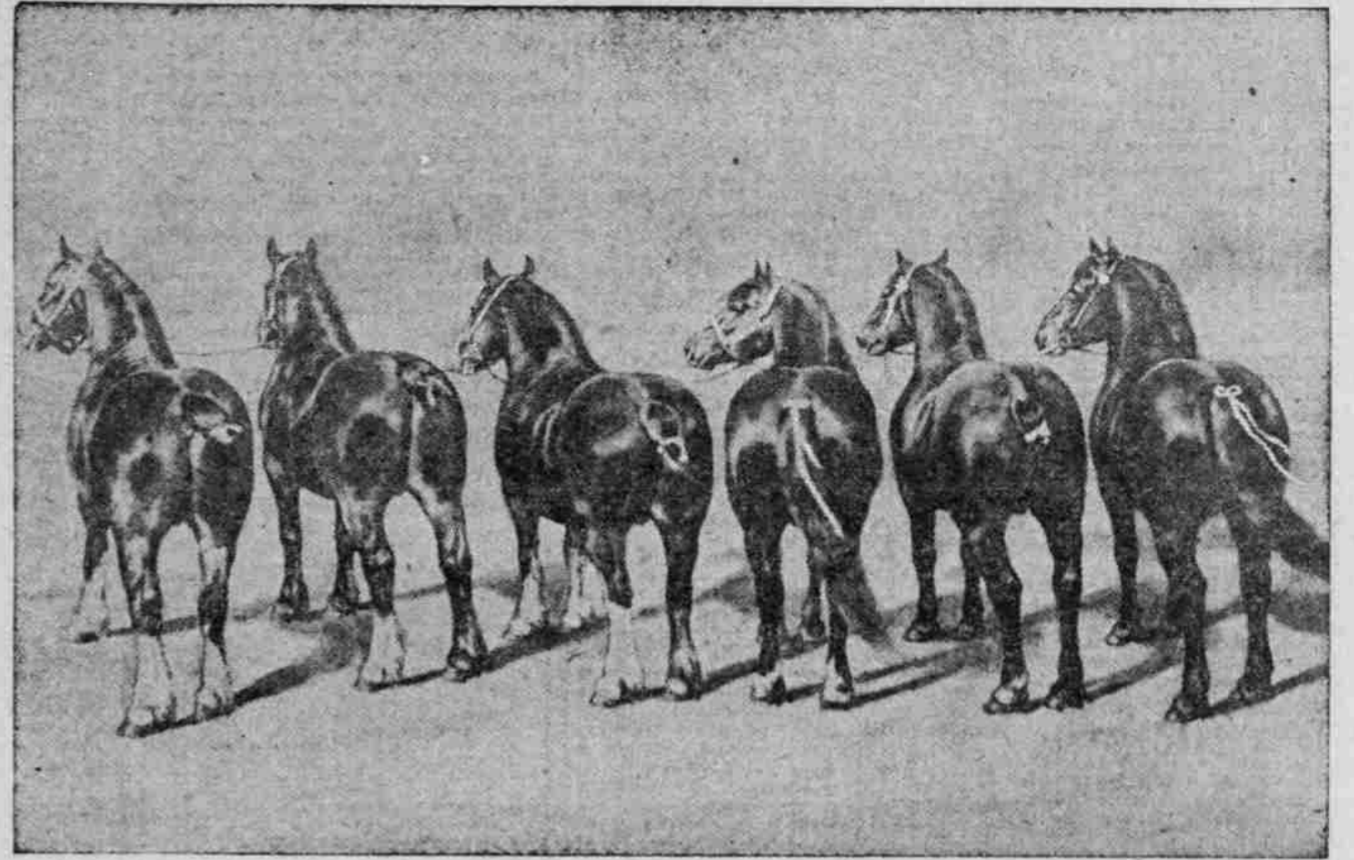

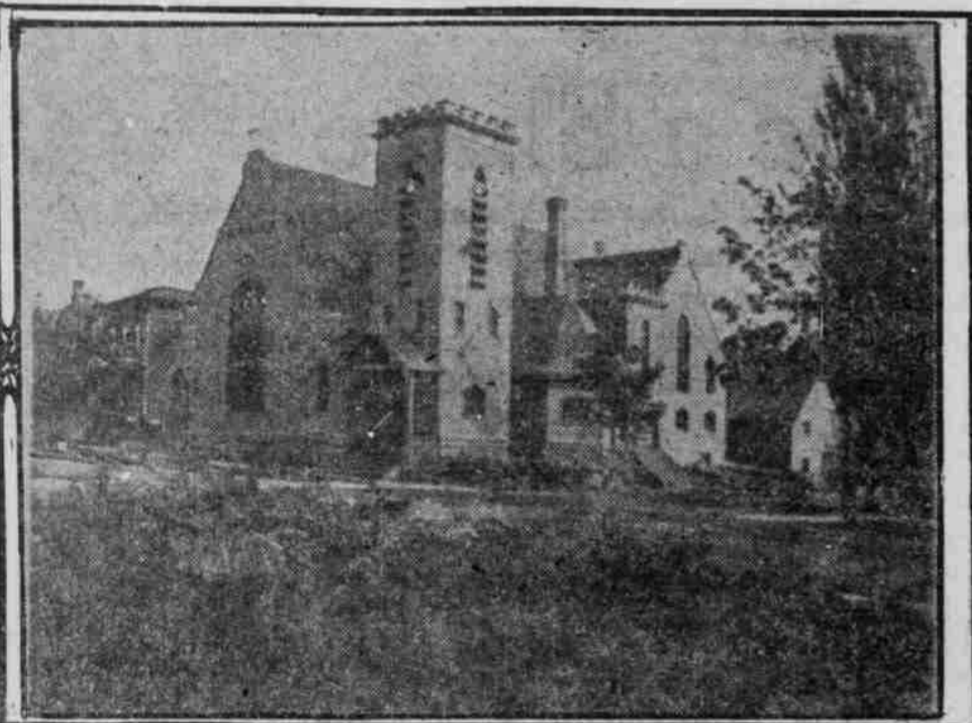

Twenty-Fifth Anniversary of Third Presbyterian Church Will Be Celebrated Today

THE celebration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Third Presbyterian Church, East Pine and Thirtieth streets, will begin this morning and close next Thursday night. Following is the general programme:

The 25 years of the existence of the Third Presbyterian Church have been important years in the history of Portland as well. When Dr. Ghormley, then fresh from a theological seminary, came to East Portland it was a small settlement and East Tenth street was considered a long way from the Willamette River. The church was built on East Seventh and Oak streets. It was moved to East Ninth and Oak and again to East Thirtieth and Pine streets, where a new and modern structure was built in 1902. Its pastors have been Dr. Ghormley, the first and founder; Dr. Arnold, who died two years ago; Rev. J. E. Snyder, now of Vancouver; Rev. Robert McLean, now of Porto Rico, and Rev. J. E. Montgomery, present pastor.
Dr. Ghormley was called to the First Presbyterian Church, of Moscow, Idaho, a college town, in 1894, remaining there seven years. He was elected synodical missionary by the synod of Washington, which gave him general supervision of the home mission work of the synod. He is now in his sixth year in this work. The synod includes Washington, five counties of Northern Idaho, and Alaska. For the past five years he has lived in Tacoma.
Rev. J. E. Snyder is also a well-known Presbyterian minister; he has been called to a prominent church in Chicago. Rev.

Robert McLean has been in Porto Rico since he left the Third Church five years ago. The Third Presbyterian Church has become one of the largest and most prosperous churches on the East Side.
