

SENATOR BOURNE'S EFFORTS

All Other Third-Term Boomers in the Senate Have Disappeared.

THOUGHT LESS CONFIDENT

Wise Ones Say Oregon Senator Has Seen the Light and Will Cast About for a Substitute.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Jan. 11.—Judging by interviews with various Senators who at one time favored the re-nomination of President Roosevelt, there is nothing left of the third-term movement. Rather, it should be said that there is only one man in the Senate who today believes, or professes to believe, that Roosevelt will be forced to accept re-nomination. That man is Senator Bourne, of Oregon. All others, who a month ago believed with Bourne that a nomination would be forced on the President, have accepted as final the reiteration of the President that under no circumstances will he accept another nomination. It would be interesting, in the opinion of those who believe that the President will not re-nominate Roosevelt, to know whether or not Senator Bourne, who down in his heart, honestly believes there is any chance of reviving the Roosevelt movement, whether he really believes, as he says, that public sentiment will break out afresh within 60 days and make certain the re-nomination of the President.

Many Favor Roosevelt at First. When the third-term agitation was at its height, a number of Senators expressed the belief that Roosevelt would be re-nominated. Senator Burrows, of the number, could foresee no other outcome, but Mr. Burrows has seen a new light, and, indeed, he has seen a new light. He believes the Republican party should nominate Justice Brewer, of the United States Supreme Court. Tom Carter, of Montana, who is now in the hands of the wagon whenever a political procession begins to move, thought he could press the re-nomination of Roosevelt. When Senator Bourne began the agitation of the third-term question (second elective term, as he styled it), one of his first recruits was Senator Hansbrough, of North Dakota. President's Closest Friend Quiet. Through the whole contest the attitude of Senator Lodge has been significant. Indeed, the re-nomination of Roosevelt is a place in that body—Lodge has never favored the re-nomination of the President, and is today unpledged to any candidate. The situation in Wyoming has always been interesting. Senator Warren reported some time ago that the state was overwhelmingly in favor of Roosevelt. A league said there was no Roosevelt sentiment in the state; today Senator Warren is an avowed advocate of nomination of Secretary Taft. The name of Senator Scott, of West Virginia, who a couple of months ago, found that the country had gone "Roosevelt crazy" and predicted Roosevelt's re-election, is now a name that Scott now sees nothing but Taft.

Bourne Alone Is Left. Every Roosevelt boomer in the Senate save Bourne, Oregon, has turned to some other candidate. Bourne does not say much, but he throws out intimations that something startling is going to happen, something that will put Taft and Hughes and Knox and Cannon and all the others out of the running and wind up in a stampede to Roosevelt, in spite of the President's personal wishes. It might be more interesting were it not for the fact that Senator Bourne is now stamped as a false prophet. Two months ago, when the re-nomination of Roosevelt was the order of the day, he declared that he would never say another word on that subject; he will not repeat his election-night declaration. But the Senator was misinformed, or else he jumped at the wrong conclusion. Had his predictions in the past been fulfilled, his present prediction would have more weight.

Evidences of His Weakening. Then, it is also to be considered that Senator Bourne privately does not talk as enthusiastically as he does publicly. Before the President spoke, Bourne had no second choice; he said it was useless to have a second choice, because the whole thing was clinched for Roosevelt. Today Senator Bourne has a second choice, according to his friends, and that second choice is Senator Knox, of Pennsylvania. The fact that Senator Bourne's confidence in the third-term movement has been shaken—else he would not have a second choice. Moreover, the Senator is known to have said, when the President reiterated his declaration that "It won't be Taft, even if Roosevelt is not re-nominated." This also indicates a lack of confidence in the Roosevelt movement.

ENGLISH IS GAINING

Supersedes French in Schools of Germany.

BY ORDER OF KAISER

Nation Realizes That Knowledge of This Language Is Necessary to Compete Commercially With Those Who Use It.

BERLIN, Jan. 11.—(Special.)—In an Imperial edict of the year 1900 the German Emperor ordered that in particular view on the increase of consideration for the English language in the gymnasiums, owing to the great importance which now attaches to a knowledge of that language. For this reason, instruction in English is to be permitted, where desired, in place of Greek, and in the three upper classes of the gymnasiums, wherever local conditions point to the desirability of such a course, English is to be made a compulsory subject instead of French, the latter remaining optional.
