LISBON, Feb. 8.—The republican leaders in Portugal are today in extremely high spirits. They assert confidently that a republic is now a matter of months, not years. The Associated Press today secured an opinion on the situation from a high official of the republican plan of campaign from perhaps the most competent spokesman of the party. This man said: "The end of the monarchy is near. It will come as unexpectedly as did the murder of the King and the Crown Prince, and the world will wake up one morning and find a republic in Portugal. I am convinced that the revolution will be a peaceful one. It is a mistake for foreigners to imagine that the people of Portugal are not awake. There is a republican organization in every town and province of the republic, and it is sending in notice of their adherence by the score, and the views of republican officers in the army. Says Monarchy Will Surrender. King Manuel is a well-intentioned boy. He starts his reign with words about the restoration of political liberty, but it is inevitable that the republican leaders of the two parties whose bankruptcy was proclaimed by King Manuel at the end of the reign, when the time comes that they realize that they cannot win, will surrender, as did Dom Pedro in Brazil. I don't think a shot will be fired. The King knows and has accepted his last fight. He had transferred every dollar he had to England. We will maintain a regime of regime an open issue in the coming campaign. We will demand that the monarchy, which has dragged down Portugal to the verge of political and financial bankruptcy, abdicate to the people. They show not yet a sign of agreement that they can only surrender. Ship of State Afloat. While the troops since last Tuesday have remained in their barracks during the daytime, Lisbon at night still shows a state of high alert. Cavalry is massed in the public squares, pickets patrol the streets, and heavily-armed soldiers guard the State Bank day and night. The financial situation is viewed with great alarm. The country is staggering under its foreign debt, and its business is almost paralyzed by the fluctuations of the gold premium. Conservative bankers consider the financial situation to be more critical than the political. The outside world, in spite of the studied censorship, which has defeated its own object, should not imagine that the throne of Portugal is tottering toward a revolution. The republic is imminent. The general situation is grave rather than alarming. Political conditions, already chaotic before the murder of the King and the Crown Prince, became utterly demoralized after the commission of these crimes. Then consternation and panic prevailed among the people. The court, and the release of France's strong hand from the helm left the ship of state afloat. But with the new cabinet, pledged to administrative methods and abolition of the dictatorship and existing measures of repression, the situation improved. King Manuel openly acknowledged the irregularity of the money advanced to the royal family under his father's reign, which were the original causes of the political turmoil, and he publicly ordered the discontinuance of this practice. It is hard to forecast the future. If things drift back to the old rut of governmental corruption whence King Carlos and Premier Franco rescued the monarchy, a republic might come. The republicans are the natural inheritors of the mistakes of the monarchy, but the masses are growing under their personal burden, and are either ignorant or indifferent to the political turmoil. Something is necessary to galvanize them into action, and this is exactly what the small but evidently desperate organization of militant republicans is trying to do. It wants to drive the people to revolt. The immediate danger in the situation comes from the fact that the police are baffled and the government unable to ascertain the extent of the ramifications of the conspiracies which have been indicated during the last fortnight by the discovery, at various places, of bombs and arms and ammunition. It was known that Premier Franco was marked for assassination. That is why he deemed it wise to flee. The assassination of the King was not expected, and it created almost a reign of terror in high places. There is not the slightest question that the plot was only half successful. The murder of the entire royal family and the extinction of the dynasty was the scheme of the conspirators. It is certain that other men of the route of the royal carriage that fatal Saturday afternoon, and that of the murder had not been committed at the Commerce, it would have been attempted elsewhere. Fear for King Manuel's Life. That same night an attempt was made to bring about a mutiny on the part of his infantry and artillery regiments in Lisbon. But the officers locked the doors of the barracks and the conspirators were unable to gain access to the men. There have been many reports of dissatisfaction in the army and navy, but careful investigation does not confirm them and it may be assumed that the military is still loyal. The latter part of this week the fear grew that an attempt would be made the day the funeral was held (Saturday) to complete the bloody work that was left unfinished a week ago. To prevent anything of this kind, extraordinary precautions were taken. At first the King insisted on following the route behind the coffins of his father and brother with his uncle, the Duke of Oporto, but was

dismayed by his mother, Queen Amelie, and the premier, Admiral Ferreira, who refused to assume any responsibility for such rashness. The generalship that is being maintained at Lisbon over both commercial and press dispatches is rigorous. There is in operation a regular star chamber to prevent any but the most trustworthy of the situation from reaching the outside world. Even letters mailed at the postoffice are opened by the authorities. The foreign newspaper correspondents who flocked into Lisbon after the tragedy were completely fettered for several days and they were informed by telegraph by officials high and low that the censorship was virtually at an end. By this means they were induced to file their messages in Lisbon. But thousands of the words written by the newspaper men never got any farther than the wastepaper basket. The censors became suspicious that they were being tricked and this belief was finally confirmed, when sections of news dispatches, taken at random in order completely to destroy the sense of the text, were returned to the writers. The censorship was applied in this most stupid fashion. Not only was everything representing Portugal to be in other than a state of blissful tranquility and deepest mourning eliminated from the outgoing press reports, but whenever a censor with a half knowledge of foreign languages saw a word that looked dangerous to the prestige of the monarchy, he was regardless of the sense and meaning. As an instance, a dispatch sent to the Associated Press denying the reports of an
