

DRUG TO MAKE BAD MEN GOOD

Ex-Professor of Columbia Announces Discovery to Repair Deficient Morals.

DRUG BUILDS UP TISSUE

With Physical Impairment Rectified, Dr. Quackenbos Says Suggestive Therapeutics Can Have Chance to Correct Morals.

NEW YORK, March 7.—(Special).—Dr. John C. Quackenbos announces that he has found a drug which will make wicked men good.

The doctor is a former professor of psychology at Columbia University, whose psycho-therapeutic researches have put him in the front rank among specialists in that branch of medicine.

CASES IN POINT

The physician made this statement while discussing the case of Captain von Goeben, the German army officer who slew Major von Schenck because of infatuation for the latter's wife, and then pleaded that mesmerism and witchcraft exerted by the woman had forced him to commit the murder.

Dr. Quackenbos also discussed the case of the Marquis of Townsend, said to be under the hypnotic control of Rev. Arthur Hobbs, curate of a fashionable London church. The Marquis is alleged to have parted with priceless heirlooms, much money and other things of value, and to have submitted to emasculation from his wife through the subtle influence of the hypnotic curate.

"Captain von Goeben was in love with another man's wife, which is an irrational thing," said Dr. Quackenbos. "Love is animal, spiritual and rational, and such details of the von Goeben case as we have, show that the rational and the spiritual were lacking in this German officer's case."
